► **TOUR TO BIOT & VALLAURIS**

Tuesday, 4 November - 14.00 /17.00

Departure for Biot, a charming Provençal village, known since the Antiquity for its large, earthenware jars, which were used to store and transport food and now decorate the gardens of Provence. Visit the famous Verrerie de Biot, a glass factory in order to see the skilled glass-blowers.

Continue to Vallauris, the "city with 100 poters", where the Romans made pottery thanks to the local clay deposits. Visit the pottery museum of Vallauris.

During its whole history, Vallauris produced kitchen pottery until the arrival of Pablo Picasso in 1947, who revolutionized the local craftsmen's technique; he lived there with Françoise Gilot, Paloma Picasso's mother.

► **TOUR TO EZE & MONACO**

Wednesday, 5 November- 9 30 /17:30

Take the direction towards the East of the Alpes-Maritimes, where you will drive through the mountainous part of the Côte d'Azur, on the French Riviera. Via the high coastline road, stop at Eze. This amazing medieval village was built on a rocky promontory. By the fortified gate from the 14th Century, visit the small, winding streets up to the exotic garden, overlooking the the village.

Continue to the Principality of **Monaco**, the second smallest country in the world after Vatican City. Walk through the narrow streets of the old town to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception where the Princes and Princesses of Monaco are buried, and then to the Palace square dominated by Prince Ranier's residence. Witness the **changing of the guards**, which takes place at 11:55 sharp everyday, and then enjoy lunch in a local restaurant on the Rock.

Free time to have a drink on the terrace of the renowned Café de Paris, or to walk around in the gardens, ornated with contemporary sculptures, or to go into the world famous Casino of Monte Carlo before to return to the Palais des Festivals.

► *INITIATION TO ESSENTIAL OILS* « *AROMATHERAPY* » *IN GRASSE*

The history of aromatics and perfumes started in Egypt around 4500 B.C. Forgotten for many years, essential oils came into use again with a therapeutic aim, following the modern works of the French researcher R.M Gattefossé. He invented the term "Aromatherapy" in 1928, and in 1936 after 30 years of test, classified the main properties of natural aromatics: antitoxic, antiviral, antiseptic, tonic, stimulating, relaxing... A powerful energising action and an undisputed healing property. By this initiation guests will discover the well-being thanks to essential oils. The first part of this course will present to you the evolution in the History and the properties of these oils. After this general presentation an essential oils kit will be distributed to each participant.

Then they will use the oils at their convenience with the explanations of a qualified practitioner in "Aromatherapy".
